The North Lambton Community Health Centre is a non-profit, community-governed organization. Working with our communities, we provide primary health care, health promotion, and community development, with a focus on people who face challenges to accessing care. One of our main priorities is to advance our culture of inclusion and diversity in the Health Centre, in the health care system, and in our communities.

Accomplishments & Goals

The Community Health Centre is extremely proud of our staff, volunteers, and partners for coming together during the pandemic. We have been able to respond quickly to needs related to the pandemic and maintain focus on people who have additional barriers.

We offer many programs and services, but our Harm Reduction work over the past two years has been a particular accomplishment. The Hep C/Harm Reduction team provides supplies and supports to people who use drugs or live with Hepatitis C. The team has been able to build trust and connections to enable outreach services across Lambton County. A unique feature of the team is that it employs peer workers to reach populations that are often hesitant to access care.

Services & Supports

Virtual services have been an area of great growth across the healthcare continuum and the Community Health Centre is no exception. Throughout the pandemic and still moving forward, we provide options for both virtual and in-person appointments and programs, including but not limited to yoga, low impact exercise, chair exercise, anxiety workshops, and more. Virtual options have been a great addition to our work at the Centre.
