Speech-Language Pathologist

Under the direction of a Supervisor of Clinical Services, and in partnership with the Clinical Services team, the Speech Language Pathologist will provide service to clients of Pathways Health Centre for Children, through Community Based Rehabilitation Services and School Based Rehabilitation Services, with the local Indigenous communities, and other programs needing Speech-Language support.

This could include but may not be limited to screenings, assessments, intervention supports, consultation, swallowing and feeding screenings, augmentative communications and counseling and education to families, primary caregivers, schools and the community.

- Registration and in good standing with the College of Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists of Ontario
- Cultural Competency training is an asset
- Fluency in French is an asset
- Ability to work independently and collaboratively with other team members
- Enthusiastic about working with children and their caregivers
- Efficient and effective time management and service delivery skills
- Excellent communication, organizational and interpersonal skills
- Experience working with children with autism, preferred
- Experience working with children with special needs, their families and the community

The successful candidate must be available to work flexible hours, must have a valid Ontario driver's license and maintain adequate liability insurance or must have ongoing access to a vehicle and driver for Pathways business.
