Audiologist

Working under the direction of the Supervisor of Clinical Services, the Audiologist is responsible for the day to day administration of the Audiology Service in accordance with the mandate, strategic directions and policies and procedures of the Centre. The Audiologist assists the Supervisor of Clinical Services in ensuring that services provided to the clients are ongoing, comprehensive and consistent with the Centre's Mission, Values and Strategic Plan. The Audiologist collaborates with other Pathways staff and community partners to ensure coordinated service delivery to clients.
